

Morris F. Collen Research Award

**ORIGINAL RESEARCH
BY A TPMG CLINICIAN**

The Morris F. Collen Research Awards recognize the efforts of TPMG physicians who make significant contributions to scientific literature and the health and welfare of Kaiser Permanente members and our communities.



MORRIS F. COLLEN, MD

In 1948, Morris F. Collen, MD, became one of the seven founding physicians of The Permanente Medical Group. As a clinician, researcher, and teacher, Dr. Collen made significant contributions to the Medical Group and Kaiser Permanente members. Today he is recognized internationally for his pioneering work in applying computer technology to medicine.

From 1953 to 1961, Dr. Collen served as Physician-in-Chief in San Francisco. He became Director of Medical Methods Research (now the Division of Research) in 1961, ending his tenure in 1979 when he became Director, Division of Technology Assessment.

To be a good physician, you have to keep up with what is new, which means you have to be involved in research and training.

So patient care is our first obligation, and to maintain a good quality of care, we must also research and teach. And we do.

Dr. Collen's work in medical computing soon attracted national attention. He was elected to the Institute of Medicine of the National Academy of Science in 1981, and served as Chair of the Library of Medicine's Board of Scientific Counselors from 1985 to 1987. As a Scholar-in-Residence from 1987 to 1993, he wrote a history of medical applications of the computer.

Since 1983, Dr. Collen has served as a Consultant with the Division of Research, and he remains an enthusiastic supporter of research and teaching in TPMG.



NANCY GOLER, MD

REGIONAL MEDICAL DIRECTOR,
EARLY START PROGRAM, NAPA/SOLANO

Nancy Goler, MD, is recognized for her groundbreaking work, which is recorded in her article, "Substance Abuse Treatment Linked with Prenatal Visits Improves Perinatal Outcomes: A New Standard," published in the *Journal of Perinatology* (2008).

Dr. Goler led a research team in evaluating KP's Early Start program over a four-year period in a study that involved nearly 50,000 pregnant women. Early Start is a unique program that provides substance abuse treatment within Ob/Gyn departments with appointments linked to routine prenatal care. This greatly increases a woman's chance of success in stopping the use of drugs, alcohol and tobacco during pregnancy.


Dr. Goler's study showed that pregnant women who received substance abuse treatment through Early Start had similar outcomes for themselves and their babies as pregnant women with no evidence of substance abuse.

Study findings clearly support the Early Start model of care for all prenatal clinics and establish the program as the gold standard for replication.

JEROME MINKOFF, MD

Jerome Minkoff, MD, is acknowledged for clinical research and as a champion for research efforts throughout KP. He was awarded numerous Kaiser Foundation Hospital research grants, and has conducted many clinical trials.


His research projects are often sparked by a clinical encounter. Once, while he was feeling a patient's thyroid gland, her pained reaction led him to uncover her childhood sexual abuse. This raised questions for him which led to several important studies on the long-term health consequences of childhood abuse and trauma.

He has long been involved in osteoporosis research and clinical guidelines development for both osteoporosis and diabetes. He participated in Phase 3 clinical trials that led to the approval of zoledronic acid, the first intravenous treatment for osteoporosis.

Dr. Minkoff is a strong proponent of collaboration between the Division of Research and clinicians. He has been instrumental in connecting clinicians with researchers to help design studies and secure funding.

HARLEY GOLDBERG, DO

ASSISTANT PHYSICIAN-IN-CHIEF, SAN JOSE

Dr. Harley Goldberg is highly regarded for his skill and tireless commitment in developing an array of continuing medical education programs in Northern California.

While he was Chief of Education in the 1990s, he helped develop a core curriculum for primary care providers in many specialty areas. Since then, he has been a driving force in implementing ambitious new programs and their CME components.

He led the way in establishing spine care clinics throughout the region and organizing CME conferences and programs. As Regional Director of Complementary and Alternative Medicine, he's developed CME programs at local and regional levels.

As chair of the Musculoskeletal Medicine Redesign initiative, he helped develop two CME programs to support this new service, one for non-surgical musculoskeletal medicine specialists and one for primary care physicians.

Dr. Goldberg's body of work is widely acknowledged as significantly improving care for members throughout Northern California.
