Few have done more to advance the nationwide collection, analyses and distribution of cardiovascular clinical outcomes data than Ralph Brindis, MD.

Dr. Brindis was among the first to encourage the American College of Cardiology to create a National Cardiovascular Data Registry in 1998.

Under his leadership from 1998 to 2008, the registry grew dramatically and now collects data from more than 11 million patient records nationwide. Information gathered from these records has proved invaluable in helping our nation's hospitals and physicians, medical device manufacturers, and pharmaceutical companies assess and improve the quality of cardiovascular care.

In March 2010, Dr. Brindis was elected President of the American College of Cardiology, an honor that attests to the high regard of his colleagues.

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
